



Note: In cases described in points 9 and 10 above, no grant funds will be released until SSHRC receives written confirmation from the Impact Assessment Agency that no IA is needed OR that a decision statement has been issued which confirms that there will be no significant adverse environmental effects or that Cabinet has justified the effects under the circumstances.
